Important Information

I have been asked to inform you that as part of the 25 year 'Streets Ahead Project' to upgrade and maintain the highway network in Sheffield, there will be over 100 major highway improvement schemes across Sheffield in the next 5 years with a focus on then maintaining the Sheffield highway network to the improved standard for the remaining 20 years. Inevitably there will be times when the works will make travelling times to and from school and work longer.

As part of this city-wide initiative work will be starting shortly in the Mosborough, Birley and Beighton areas. Work is scheduled to take place between February and July 2013 so improvements can made to: street lighting, drainage improvement sites, structural works, pavement resurfacing/kerbing and road resurfacing and white-lining.

We have been notified of a complaint that has been made to police about alleged inconsiderate and dangerous driving around school at the beginning and end of the school day. Clearly there are lots of children and toddlers on the pavements and crossing roads at the beginning and end of the day, and so there is a greater potential for accidents to occur. Please drive considerately and safely and ask any grandparents or carers to do the same. Thank you.

Timetable Changes

Since September we have been planning a number of improvements to address key issues in school. Inevitably this will lead to changes being made to the way we do some things currently. The introduction of mixed age 'Big Maths'; the 'Read Write Inc' literacy system and a renewed approach to collective worship will require some alterations being made to the current timetable for example. One impact will be that 'Wake and Shake' will now be done before school starts, in the playground, when the weather permits. It will continue to be led by our older children and all pupils (as well as any enthusiastic parents/carers) will be invited to take part. We will give you more in due course.

For information, we will be holding a parent/carer workshop about the new Read Write Inc system in the coming weeks, so that you understand how the system works to support literacy development in our young people. I will give you more information as soon as the date is fixed. Thanks you.

Statement to Live By

What is it about these groups of people that make them unstoppable even though there are so many difficult challenges? How could the attitude displayed by these groups of people who were united in their determination to achieve great things help in our classes, school, parish and local area?

Crucial Crew

Recently Y6 went on a trip to Crucial Crew. We went inside a building, which had a mimic street and learnt a lot of safety tips. Inside the street there was a court, the class were all given different roles and we acted out a court service.

We learnt many different topics about health and safety, our first subject being about fire, where we watched a video showing how fast it can spread and what safety precautions can be taken.

We moved into another large room (with a few other schools) and watched another video about fake phone calls, and the serious consequences of emergency services called out to fake incidents whilst unable to attend real ones.

We also discussed some first aid, including how to stop someone from losing too much blood from a wound and all about placing an unconscious person in the recovery position.

Overall, I think it was an incredible trip, great experience and have learnt many things from my visit.
