There will be a presentation and meeting about the proposed residential trip to the Hollowford Centre, Castleton, for the Autumn term 2013. The meeting will take place on Wednesday

27th February 2013 in Mr Smith's classroom, starting at 3.45pm. A letter will be sent to all parents next week with a reply slip which must be returned to school before the half term holiday so that we know how many people will be attending.

New Developments

After the forthcoming holiday we will adopt a new timetable in school to support the introduction of the Read Write Inc literacy system and other initiative aimed at improving our provision. The changes will also facilitate certain other changes we are making in school.

We will also be introducing a renewed system of Collective Worship which encourages our children to become more familiar with our formal prayers, psalms and readings. I will give you more detailed information about this in next week's newsletter. The renewed approach to collective worship coupled with the work Mrs Humphries is doing currently to develop our curriculum for Personal Social Health Citizenship Education (PSHCE) means that there will be no more 'Pastoral Group' sessions. Consequently, today was the last Pastoral Group session. I am very grateful to Mrs Asquith who has planned the Pastoral Group activities this academic year, and to all colleagues and children for making the sessions so positive. We will continue to develop ways for children of different ages to learn and play together. This will include developing a 'Buddy' system in the future so that these important relationships can continue to be fostered across our school community.

After the holiday each class will receive music lessons delivered by a specialist music teacher each Friday. For the first three weeks it will be Mr Burt, but from week four we will be joined by Miss Pendlebury who will plan and deliver the National Curriculum music lessons and lead hymn practice. She also aims to establish a lunchtime choir and an after school music group. Mr Burt will continue to offer peripatetic music lessons and support services and liturgies that do not take place on Fridays. I am very grateful to Mr Burt for all he brings to our community.
