Staff News

I am delighted to be able to share with you the news that **Mrs Evans** is expecting a baby and will go on maternity leave from September 2014. We have advertised for a high quality teacher to cover her maternity leave.

I am also very pleased to be able to share that **Ms Pendlebury**, our specialist music teacher, is also expecting a baby and will commence her maternity leave in the second week of Term 6.

Mrs Birch, who worked mornings in our office, and also as a Midday Supervisor and as a Playworker for SASH, has now been employed on a full-time basis in the office to support Mrs Battams with the increased workload that has come with our conversion to academy status. Mrs Birch will therefore, be the person to speak to for all the general enquiries such as dinners, milk, uniform, trips, after school activities, absences etc as Mrs Battams will be more involved in the budget, admissions and more complex administrative issues.

Mrs Johnson, one of our Kitchen Assistants, has left us to take up full time employment and Mrs Wallace, one of the Midday Supervisors has been appointed as her replacement. As both Mrs Birch and Mrs Wallace resigned from their Midday Supervisory posts we are pleased to inform you that Mrs Wood and Mrs Grayson, who have been helping us on a 'supply' basis, have been appointed to take their places. I am very sad to announce some teaching staff departures at the end of the school year:

- Miss Kipling will be leaving St John Fisher in July after many years of loyal service. She is an outstanding teacher who is utterly dedicated to the care of all her children. Since my appointment Miss Kipling has been one of my key people, and I am very grateful to her for the way she has managed improvements in English throughout school. She will be missed by us all deeply. Miss Kipling leaves us to take up a significant leadership role in a large school in the Derby area where she now lives.
- Ms Farrow, Miss Rodgers and Miss Rybka will also leave us at the end of the year. I am so grateful to
 them all for the way they have supported us since last summer. They joined us in difficult circumstances
 following our Ofsted inspection and have all contributed so much to our community since September. I
 am really grateful to them all for their hard work and dedication, and we wish them well for the future.

Mrs Evans and I have therefore been very focused on working with Governors and our Diocesan partners to secure high quality replacements. We designed a rigorous selection process and had a good response to our advertisements. Part of the selection process included visits to the candidates' schools to see them in action, look at their classrooms and the work produced by their children and to talk to some of their children and their Headteachers when possible. We were determined to get the high quality teachers our children and you deserve.

I am very pleased to announce that following this process Mr Broadhead, Mrs Darken, Mrs Holloway and Miss Speed were recruited and will join the teaching team from September, though I am arranging for them to join us for the special transition day to meet their new classes in the last week of this school year. They will also join colleagues for staff training so that they are ready to 'hit the ground running' when they start. They will also be available to meet you at the 'Welcome Meetings' at the very beginning of the next school year.

Obviously I have provisional plans for staffing next year but these cannot be confirmed or shared with you until after the half-term holiday, as that is the last resignation date for teachers. Please be assured however, that you will be told who your child(ren)'s teachers are as soon as everything is confirmed. Thank you.
