
Welcome Meetings

PTFA Cheese & Wine

I would like to thank the PTFA committee for organising a Cheese & Wine information event last night to talk about the PTFA and share information about all the things they have done for our community in the last eighteen months.

The PTFA Committee was formed from a group of parents who did not know each other before getting involved. Through their involvement they are now firm friends and welcome anyone interested in getting involved in any way to join them.



Through their efforts – and with the support of you, our families - a staggering £6000 was raised, which is incredible! For a small school like St John Fisher, budgets are always incredibly tight as we have many of the same overheads as much bigger two-form entry schools but about half their income. So the money raised helps us provide those special extras that would otherwise be difficult to afford.

I would like to thank the PTFA and you for supporting the different events they organise. Sadly, apart from PTFA members and school staff only <u>one</u> parent was able to make it last night. We have therefore put the PTFA display up in the corridor next to the main entrance for you to look at.

If you can spare a little time or have a good idea to share, the PTFA really would like to hear from you. Your involvement need not be huge and would always be appreciated. It is also a great way to make new friends and get involved in a group that is making a huge difference to our school community. Thank you.

The Building Fund

As you know one of my core aims is to improve the buildings and the physical environment so that our building is fresh, bright, modern and appealing to both the children and my colleagues who work hard to inspire them every day. There is *much* to do before this will be achieved, but I am determined.

To achieve this I:

- work with Governors to ensure that our modest and stretched budget is fully utilised
- work with our strategic partners AHR (formally Aedas) to secure/implement Government capital grants
- work with the PTFA to raise money to improve different areas of school for our children e.g. the library
- work with the Probation Service's Community Payback scheme to do small jobs around the school

At the beginning of Term 2 work starts on the new kitchen, car park and improving fire safety provision throughout school. You will recall that we decided to delay starting work on the kitchen until after our appeal to the secretary of State was heard - which thankfully was successful. This means that the two grants and projects can be merged by AHR which is better for ensuring value for money.

Another important way to raise money is through 'The Building Fund'. This is raised by a £20 donation from each family. This is a voluntary contribution but key if we are going to continue making those important improvements to the building that our children deserve. I really do need your support so we can do things like refurbish all the classrooms and the toilets. A letter from the Governing Body will be sent home soon and I would be really grateful if you would think seriously about supporting us by making a contribution.
