This week's book recommendation comes from Mrs Hadfield and is called '**Why is Nita Upside Down?**' by Roxana Bouwer


#### **Mrs Hadfield writes:**


This week's recommendation comes from Miss Brownbill and is called '**London Eye Mystery**' by Siobhan Dowd.
