#### **Building Work Update**

The programme of works is progressing well. The contractor is preparing to knock through from the new kitchen to the hall so that they can install the steels that will support its roof. All the shelves have been removed from the long corridor leading to FS2 and KS1 as we prepare for some work tomorrow and the Y1 classroom has been gutted. The children have moved temporarily into the library where they will be mainly based until the works have finished. A new exit to their outside area has been cut through and the wooden walls are being replaced with brick which will also improve insulation. The classroom will then benefit from a complete refurbishment.

The children in Year 2 will also be moving out of their classroom temporarily whist that is refurbished and a new exit is added to open up access to the green space behind school for play and learning. They will be moving out on 23<sup>rd</sup> January and work will start on 25<sup>th</sup> January. The children will be based mainly in the parish centre, and we are extremely grateful to Fr Paul for helping us. The refurbishment of both rooms and the corridor is due to be completed in time for the first day of Term 4 (after the half-term holiday).

We have talked to the children about being safe and sensible during the works and they have responded brilliantly. Everyone is remaining positive in spite of the upheaval and we are just excited about the improvements being made for the children.
