


Arthur Labinjo-Hughes



our solar system. So buckle up, join the tour, and get your learn on! To find out more about this book or purchase it, please click <u>here</u>. Thank you.


For our older children our feature book is: Overheard in a Tower Block by Joseph Coelho.

Recounting the childhood of a child living in a city tower block, many of these poems are sad or angry and bristle with an edginess that older children may find refreshing when compared to other poetry aimed at them.

Unlike Coelho's previous work which was focused at primary school children, this collection deals with a variety of difficult issues around parental absence, growing up, bullying, but also less everyday concepts like mythology and nature.

There's a real spread of form and content so children will be able to pick out pieces that particularly resonate.

Statement of Belief

Next week our 'Statement of Belief' is 'I can work, rest and pray every day'.

Time to talk: Together you could think about all the things you do in a typical day from the moment you wake up in the morning to the moment you go to bed. Why not make a list and see how long it is? What things do you do every day? What things do you do now and again? What do you enjoy? What do you like less?

Using different coloured pens highlight/underline:

- in the first colour, anything to do with work or school;
- in the second colour, anything you do that is about 'you' time relaxing and rest; and
- in the third colour, the moments when you pray (and listen) to God.

What do you notice? Is your day balanced? What do you struggle to find time for? How could you plan your days differently?
