

Statement to Live By

Next week our 'statement to live by' is "I try to accept the forgiveness of others."

Time to talk: When we make a mistake or hurt someone we can end up feeling quite embarrassed and even ashamed of ourselves. We can be so cross with ourselves that we find it hard to accept forgiveness from the person or people we have hurt or let down. We might feel that we do not deserve it; that we are somehow beyond forgiveness. The real truth is that we are never beyond God's mercy and accepting forgiveness is just as important as offering forgiveness to others who hurt us. Jesus died to take away our sins and so when we are forgiven we are really forgiven. What do we always say when forgiveness is shared and accepted in our school? Can you think of a time when you did something wrong and then found it hard to accept forgiveness? What happened?
