# Bringing Toys and Cards into School

From time to time children can bring special items in; to show their teacher, me or for show and tell (in line with class arrangements), but this must be occasional and the items must be handed straight to the teacher at the beginning of the day and left with him/her until the end of the day i.e. not kept by the child and taken out into the playground etc.

Obviously children can bring in items in response to a direct request from their teacher - as part of topic work for example, we just do not want them to bring in toys, swapping cards and other personal items. Thank you.

### Non Uniform Day


