FS2 Outdoor Learning Area

I am delighted to inform you that work on the FS2 outdoor learning area is almost complete. There are just one or two snags to put right. The project was funded by a £10K grant which was secured from the 'The Big Lottery Fund' following an application by the PTFA.

The area was designed by a team from 'Ground Designs' who worked closely with Mrs Darken, Mrs Prentice and myself in order to create an inspiring and useable space for our children. The removal of the broken chain-link fence and the replacement with a gate means that the space is also easily accessible to the children and staff of Y1.

The space will be open for children to use in January, once the safety checks have been completed. Until then, we respectfully ask you to not let your children use the new equipment.


When we returned the children enjoyed a picnic party lunch instead of the usual lunch, capping a very special day in the life of our community.
