


- Y6** **Sofia** for producing a brilliant piece of descriptive writing based on the nativity story. Well done!




**Maths Champions!**


**SJF Safeguarding Update: Whisper Button**

At St John Fisher we take the safeguarding and wellbeing of our children extremely seriously and remind our children continually of their right to feel **happy, safe and loved** every day in and out of school. Children are encouraged to **'Tell! Tell! Tell!'** if they are worried about anything or anyone.

We already provide children with options (and opportunities) for raising issues and accessing support, including:

- ✓ **'Wishes, Whys and Worries'** boxes located in different locations around school
- ✓ **'The Hub'** (at lunchtimes)
- ✓ **Healthy Minds Champions** (peers who are trained by the Sheffield Healthy Minds Team)
- ✓ **a qualified Mental Health Worker** - school-based and provided by the Sheffield Healthy Minds Team
- ✓ **emotionally available staff** (including, Mr Murphy, our Inclusion & Learning Mentor) who are visible and who have received accredited *Trauma-Informed Schools UK* and *Positive Regard* training

We have decided to add a 'Whisper Button' to the homepage of our website as a further option, in partnership with the South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL). 'Whisper' is an anonymous reporting tool which has been designed by SWGfL. The tool aims to further empower school communities by providing them with an extra channel for reporting safeguarding issues and concerns, via a simple online form or text. The reports can be made anonymously though the inclusion of names will sometimes make it easier for concerns to be verified and followed up. Click [here](#) to link to our online 'Whisper' form.
