

SJF Passion Play 2024







We will seek feedback, more formally, in our forthcoming annual questionnaire, and we will explore the feasibility of offering phone calls, instead of video calls, if this is what more people want. The option for face-to-face meetings will, of course, remain.

Preparation for Y6 End of Key Stage Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs)

The purpose of the week is not only to help the children prepare for the process, with lots of support if they need it, but also to identify their strengths and any remaining gaps to focus on in their lessons and booster sessions. Time to talk: We know that making mistakes is a normal part of learning. Making mistakes as we learn is ok and completely normal.

Worrying about them can turn us into fearful learners, who find learning scarier and therefore more difficult. This can cause us to struggle trying new things and reaching our potential.

Trying new things is what confident learners are happier doing. Just having a go is important. Trusting grown-ups when they offer encouragement is important too. Understanding that mistakes might be made – and it is ok if they happen - is also very important.
