Here is a message from Mr Broadhead:

"What an amazing visit we all enjoyed to the Madina Mosque on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July! We started the day with an interesting journey using public transport during which our children displayed model behaviour even though we had to use both a tram and a bus.

Our guide told us about **Wudhu** and gave us a demonstration. Wudhu is the ritual washing performed by Muslims before prayer. Muslims must be clean and wear good clothes before they present themselves before God.

We had a tour and a chance to see the main prayer area. We were able to watch Amna and Eesaa pray in Arabic. Everyone was very impressed and thought they were amazing (and our guide was very impressed with them too).
