RE Topic 2: Life Choices

Children will learn that through Baptism the Christian is called to a life of holiness and to the mission of spreading the Good News. That may be lived out in different ways. Whatever life choices are made, the Christian is called to a commitment of holiness and service of others. Children will explore the Sacrament of Marriage.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- Talk about any commitments they have and how they make them feel.
- Share any experiences of the Sacrament of Marriage.

English: Basic Skills – Reading, Phonics, Spelling, Handwriting

Read Write Inc Sessions

Children on the Read Write Inc programme will continue to have daily sessions with their group aimed at developing confidence with phonics, reading and writing. Children are assessed regularly to ensure that they are in the right group. If you would like more information about the programme please let us know.

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from having regular handwriting and spelling practise and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their *individual* needs.

Guided Reading

All children no longer involved in the Read Write Inc programme will have daily reading activities to boost their levels of confidence and enjoyment as well as their comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- Reading your child's reading books with them for a few minutes every day as well as enjoying all sorts of other books and reading materials together.
- Encouraging your child to read more challenging texts/different genres to what they are used to in order to widen their reading experience.

Mathematics: Daily Number & Calculation Skills

We will focus on:

- 1. Reading, writing, ordering and comparing whole numbers and decimals with up to two places.
- 2. Recognise and continue sequences of numbers and use number patterns and relationships.
- 3. Use understanding of place value to multiply and divide whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.
- 4. Use a written method to add and subtract decimals.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- Encourage children to read large numbers as whole numbers not digits e.g telephone numbers. 248 5009 is read as two hundred and forty eight thousand, five thousand and nine etc.
- Challenge children to multiply numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 in their heads.
