#### **Internet Safety Workshops**

#### Children

As part of 'Be Safe – Be Happy Week' pupils will have an age-appropriate lesson with Mrs Finnegan, an internet safety expert from the Local Authority to inform and update them on how to be responsible and safer online. This is an ongoing priority and supplements the continuous work done as part of the SJF computing curriculum.

#### Parents & Carers

We also invite parents and carers to join us for one of two workshops on **Wednesday 7th November 2018** at **3.30pm** and **5.00pm** in the **Y6 classroom**. The purpose is to provide updates on potential threats and offer advice on what can be done to reduce the threats faced by our children. During the first workshop children will be supervised by a member of staff in a room close by. I do hope that lots of you will be able to join us.







#### **Mathematics Workshops**

The third of our mathematics workshops is on **Monday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2018**. The focus will be on multiplication and division. The format will be the same as the last workshop for addition and subtraction. The feedback from those who attended the last two workshops has been incredibly positive, so I do urge you to come along.

My Colleagues will be sharing our teaching approaches and the things we look for from the children in response. If you are interested in finding out more so that you can grow your own understanding and/or feel more confident supporting your child(ren) at home, please do try to come along. If anyone would like additional 1:1 support please speak to us in confidence. Children will be supervised by staff during the sessions.

#### **Keeping Children Safe Online**

Social media sites and apps are created so that different people can connect across the UK and the world. This can be both a good and bad thing as it can bring people together but also, potentially, expose any vulnerable person to the risk of connecting with someone who is dangerous and who is seeking to groom children. It is for this reason that most sites claiming to be responsible, have age restrictions. Parents and carers who allow (or even help) their children to get around these rules and could be placing their children at risk.

Today there is so much peer pressure on children to have a social media presence everywhere, with many of the safer more child-friendly sites deemed 'uncool'. Please do not help your children to get around the rules restricting access to sites, even if they tell you that EVERYONE else they know is allowed by their parents to be on the site. Age limits are not there to ruin lives, they exist to protect children - and it is worth remembering they are **minimum** age limits. **None** of the sites highlighted on the next page are for primary-aged pupils anyway. With so many ways to access the internet, it is simply not possible to monitor everything a child does (or is exposed to) on social media sites - even for the most determined and well-intentioned of parents/carers.

Please join us for one of our internet safety workshops at either 3.30pm or 5.00pm on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November to find out more. Both workshops take place in the Y6 classroom with childcare be offered at the earlier one.

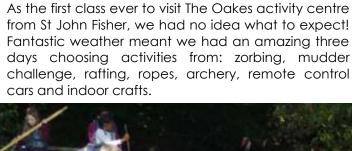

#### Be Safe - Be Happy Week 2018

Next week is 'Be Safe Be Happy Week 2018' and this year we will focus on being **happy** and **safe** and in ourselves. Throughout the week, the children will take part in a range of different activities that promote personal safety, happiness and well-being. We will focus on:

- bullying in its different forms and what we should do if we see it happening or experience it ourselves
- being healthy and proud of who we are
- being respectful of others and everything they are
- personal hygiene
- eating healthily
- being safe online
- basic first aid
- personal safety (using NSPCC primary resources)

#### Across the week we will be working with:

- Links coaches completing sports groups with the children to promote sport and activity to help us feel
  positive, happy and healthy. The pupils are asked to come to school wearing their SJF PE uniform on the
  following days:
  - o FS2 and KS1 pupils (Years 1 and 2) on Wednesday 7th November
  - o KS2 pupils (Years 3, 4, 5 and 26) on Thursday 8th November
- Taylor Shaw will be working with each class over two days; preparing healthy food with the children and doing some food tasting activities
- Mrs Finnegan, an internet safety expert from the Local Authority will be talking to the children about how
  to be safer online. There will also be two workshops for parents/carers after school in the Y6 classroom on
  Wednesday 7th November 2018 at 3.30pm (childcare provided) and at 5.00pm. You are all very welcome!
- a nurse will talk to the children about the importance of being hygienic
- a firefighter will talk to the younger children about fire safety
