Uniform

Our uniform is important and pupils are expected to wear it and look smart every day. Our uniform is key to our identity and reflects our ethos, standards and high expectations.



Official Uniform Suppliers

Parents and carers can also purchase uniform items in the correct colours without a logo from other sources, including PE uniform, but these must be completely plain. **No** designer labels, including Addidas, Nike and Puma for PE kit or other embellishments. Please note the PE kit is a light blue t-shirt, burgundy shorts, burgundy sweatshirt/hoodie (only for PE) and light grey joggers, NOT black.







Earrings, Jewellery & Watches

Children are <u>not</u> permitted to wear earrings/studs or any kind of jewellery at school. Basic and sensible watches <u>are</u> permitted. Apple watches and fitbits can be problematic because (a) they are expensive and can be lost and damaged; and (b) they can be distracting - and we have had to speak to children about playing with them in the past. However we do recognise that wearing a sensible watch can help children learn to tell the time. For this reason children are only allowed to wear a sensible and straightforward analogue or digital watch to school. No 'smart' watches and no watches with laser pointers, cameras or other gimmicks – just a normal watch please. Thank you for your support.

School Shoes

Children must wear proper black school shoes whilst in school. No trainers, even all black ones or high boots. No open sandals either – feet need to be covered and protected.

Children can wear trainers to and from school and at break-times to play football etc. (to protect school shoes). They can also wear high boots and wellies to and from school in bad weather as long as they also bring shoes to change in to. Please help us maintain our high uniform standards by supporting us. Thank you.


Mathematics Workshop for Parents/Carers

The workshops will be led by Mrs Holloway and Mrs Broadhead, supported by colleagues and will begin in the Y6 classroom or school hall, depending on numbers attending.



Please join us if you want to understand more fully how we teach the four operations of Mathematics at SJF throughout school.

Obviously methods and approaches change and develop over time, so attending the workshops will bring you up to date with current thinking around modern approaches to teaching and learning, and particularly the drive to embed children's understanding of related mathematical vocabulary.

You will also be given tips on how you can support your children at home.

Please also join us if you struggle (or have struggled) with Mathematics and speak to one of us in confidence so that we can provide support and advice.

Supervised care will be offered to the children of those attending in another classroom close by. Thank you,


REMINDER: Pupil Premium Grant

If you are (or have been) in receipt of benefits of one kind or another then your children might be entitled to a Pupil Premium Grant and free school meals. The grant is also available to children in care or those with parents serving in the UK armed forces. The grant provides school with much needed additional money to support vulnerable children. It is very important that you tell us.

Some eligible parents/carers of children in FS2/Y1/Y2 do not think they have to claim because their children are already eligible for infant free school meals as part of a government scheme. This is wrong. It is important that these parents/carers also apply for the Pupil Premium Grant if they are entitled or we will not receive the additional funding.
